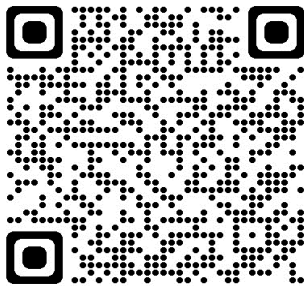
Zone Kin of the Year - (2 will be awarded in each Zone) To qualify for this award, you must be nominated by a fellow Kin in District 3. The person doing the nominating is asked to write a letter outlining the nominee's Kin achievements and how the nominee has impacted their Club, Zone, and District.

Outstanding Kin of the Year - By written submission, the nominating party must outline why they feel one District 3 Kin member deserves the honor of being recognized as most exemplifying the Objects of our Association, taking into consideration how the nominee has impacted District 3.

The Kin Community Award - This award is to recognize two or more clubs that have an incredible working relationship. These clubs work together to make an impact in their communities.

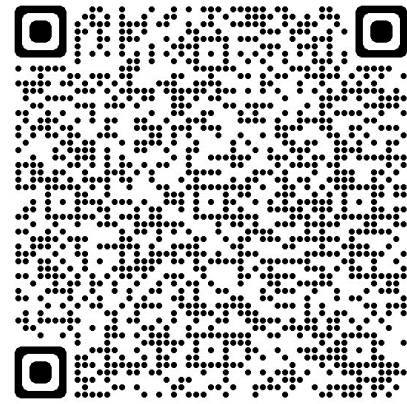
KIN-Educate Club Award - To encourage clubs to provide opportunities for members to learn about Kin and promote participation in the various educational resources that Kin has to offer.

NATIONAL PERSONAL AWARDS

Kin Excellence Program:

- **Tier 1: Maple Leaf Award of Distinction**

To encourage participation in club activities while becoming familiar with all aspects of the Association. To stimulate self-development, improve communication and foster leadership skills within the first two (2) years of being a Kin member

- **Tier 2: Founder's Award for Achievement**

To build upon the skills and knowledge gained while pursuing the Maple Leaf Award of Distinction.

- **Tier 3: Members Award of Excellence**

To continue to build upon the objectives of the Maple Leaf of Distinction Award and the Founders Award for Achievement. The Members Award of Excellence is for members with more than 5 years of Kin experience.

GEM Award - To recognize individual commitment to membership growth within the Association.

Kin Canada Lifetime Achievement Award - This Award is considered the highest Award in the Association. It is awarded to a member who has dedicated his or her Kin life to the betterment and the furthering of the Association and its goals.

Outstanding Kin Award - To recognize one member who embodies excellence in volunteerism through their contributions of leadership, inspiration, and dedication to Kin Canada

National President's Commendation -

Its purpose is to create a culture of appreciation and gratitude for members within the Association.

Cystic Fibrosis Canada Awards (National)

The Ian F. McClure Award - Introduced in 2014 to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Kin-Cystic Fibrosis Canada partnership. It is awarded to a member in recognition of their exceptional skills coordinating and motivating groups of donors and volunteers for fundraising projects that benefit Cystic Fibrosis Canada and Canadians living with cystic fibrosis.

NATIONAL CLUB AWARDS

Boake Efficiency & Outstanding Boake

Efficiency Award - To recognize those Clubs which effectively meet the Zone, District and National requirements.

Outstanding Club Award - Note: Clubs must earn the Boake Efficiency Award to be eligible. To promote a standard of excellence for club activities and administration in the Association and to recognize achievement, leadership, and participation of outstanding clubs

Ken Pierce Membership Growth Award – To promote and recognize club growth. No action required by the clubs. National Headquarters will review the June 30th year end membership numbers to determine the winning clubs

HREF Ambassadors of Learning Award - To encourage clubs to participate in fundraising and community engagement activities in their community specifically for the HREF – Kin Canada Bursaries Program. To recognize the club that has demonstrated commitment to HREF through creative and engaged projects, promotional opportunities, and commitment of funds.

Hal & Elspeth Rogers National Service Award - To encourage clubs to participate in service work within their community. To recognize the club that has contributed the most to the fundamental objective of the Association – service.

Cystic Fibrosis Canada Awards

Bill Skelly Award - Bill Skelly is the Kinsman credited with launching the Kin-Cystic Fibrosis Canada partnership. In 1963, Mr. Skelly invited Dr. Doug Crozier to speak to the North York Kinsmen Club about cystic fibrosis (CF). The following year, District 8 adopted CF as its service project. Over the course of the next four decades, the Kin-CF connection developed into a vibrant and unique partnership.

The Bill Skelly Award recognizes outstanding Kinsmen, Kinette and Kin clubs across Canada. Clubs are awarded for their efforts in raising funds and public awareness in the fight against cystic fibrosis. One award is presented per District, per year.
