## **1. Appointment of Foundation Representative**

The appointment representative for the Kinsmen Foundation Board will be held in a manner as set out in the Kinsmen Foundation Inc. Constitution and By-laws.

The representative for this two-year term can be either a Kinsmen or Kinette in good standing. Details can be found in the Constitution and By-laws of the Kinsmen Foundation Inc.

## **2. District Convention Appointments**

Prior to the Annual Meeting, the District Executive will appoint:

- a) Rules of Order Chair
- b) Sergeant at Arms
- c) Credentials Chair
- d) Secretary
- e) Vote Counters

## **3. District Office**

The District will maintain a permanent Kinsmen Foundation and District Executive office.

Appropriate office staff shall be employed to attend delegated business of the District Executive Council, the Kinsmen Foundation Inc. and TeleMiracle.

## **4. TeleMiracle**

That whenever possible TeleMiracle shows originate from either Saskatoon or Regina, the committee organizing such TeleMiracle Show may be composed from the membership of any club or clubs (in good standing) in District 3 approved by the Board of the Kinsmen Foundation Inc.

## **5. Kinsmen Foundation Chair - Directors of District**

The Chair of the Kinsmen Foundation Inc. be one of the 6 allowable directors of the District Executive Council.

## **6. Foundation Financial Statement**

The Kinsmen Foundation shall present to the members of District 3 Kinsmen and Kinettes a financial statement of TeleMiracle and Foundation at the Fall Leadership Conference.

## **7. National Fundraising Programs**

No charitable fundraising programs proposed by the National Executive shall be endorsed by District 3 or promoted in Saskatchewan without the prior approval of the District 3 Executive and Kinsmen Foundation.

## **8. Crime Stoppers of Saskatchewan - Support**

Crime Stoppers of Saskatchewan is a recognized partner of the District III Kinsmen & Kinettes

## **9. Crime Stoppers - Levy**

Each member in the Association of Kinsmen and Kinettes may donate funds towards Crime Stoppers of Saskatchewan.

## **10. The Kinsmen Foundation Inc. election of Vice-Chair**

- a. Any individual wishing to stand for election as the Vice-Chair of the Kinsmen Foundation Inc. is required to submit nomination papers to the Kinsmen Foundation Inc. Office by the close of business April 30 of the year. Nomination papers received by the Kinsmen Foundation Office will be delivered to the Kinsmen Foundation Management Committee at its next meeting.
- b. With respect to the election of the Vice-Chair of the Kinsmen Foundation:
  - i) The election for Vice Chair of the Kinsmen Foundation will be a ballot vote at District Convention.
  - ii) A club may ensure their votes are cast by selecting an Accredited Delegate to

- represent their club.
- iii) The Accredited Delegate can be chosen by each club in accordance with National Policy 3.04.
  - iv) The Accredited Delegate must present himself/herself for registration to the credential desk at the convention according to the procedure established by the Credential committee. Any delegate who does not register at the credentials desk shall be deemed to have abstained his/her votes.

## **11. Election Of Kin Zone Representatives**

- a) Election of Zone Representatives from zones B, F, G, I will occur at the Spring Zone Conferences in even numbered years. [October 2022]
- b) Election of Zone Representatives from zones A, C, D, H and E, will occur at Spring Zone Conference in odd numbered years.
- c) The term of office for Zone Representatives is two years.
- d) The Zone representative shall be a Kin in good standing pursuant to Article 2, Section 4. In the case of a vacancy for whatever reason the Chair of the Board after consultation with the Executive Committee will have the power to appoint a new Zone Representative to complete the remaining term.
- e) "A Zone Representative cannot be elected to serve more than two consecutive terms. A Past Zone Representative may be appointed to serve a term at the discretion of the Chair if no candidate for Zone Representative is elected.
- f) In the event a Spring Zone Conference fails to elect a Zone representative, the Chair of the Board, in consultation with the Executive Committee, will have the power to appoint a suitable person.
- g) Elections for the position of Zone Representative shall be held at the Spring Zone Conference. Candidates shall be entitled to speak (5-minute maximum plus introduction of 5 minute maximum) to the members gathered there. Voting shall be by ballot and the winner declared by a simple majority.
- h) Two Kin in good standing, on submission of a resume, to be appointed by the Executive Committee by June 30 every year for a two year term. This position will be referred to as the Kin Representative at Large and will be drawn from the general Kin population in District III(Saskatchewan). A call for expression of interest by May 15 would be made every year and the selection will be made after all Zone Elections have concluded. Kin Representative at Large (1) will be appointed odd numbered years and Kin Representative at Large (2) will be appointed in even numbered years. In the event there were elections in Zones where there were other candidates available, this would be an initial pool to draw from, but other expressions of interest will also be considered.

## **12. Fall Leadership Conference and District Convention**

There is a rotational schedule in place for the hosting of both the Fall Leadership Conference and District Convention. It will be up to the clubs within the assigned zones to determine location and host club duties. This will alleviate the difficulty in finding host locations and ensure that the events are moved around the district, allowing all members equal access.
