This form can also be printed out to be filled out during a meeting then submitted to the club electives. Any and all ways of proceeding with a Club Health Assessment is a great way to have an open and honest dialogue about potential club issues, as well as being a great member check-in even if no concerns are voiced. 



Foundation Report for District (Feb 26, 2022)

- It is a time of growth in the Foundation Office! We have now added two new employees to our staff. At the beginning of January we welcomed Amanda Whyte into the role of Grants Assistant. Amanda stepped into this role seamlessly, having three years of volunteer experience with the Foundation Board as Zone Rep and Treasurer. We are also excited to have Carman Praski join the office team in the new role of Fund Development Manager. Carman began his new position February 1st. Now that these two roles are filled, the office has implemented the new organizational chart which was created through an HR Alignment project completed earlier this board year. This was a key area for development identified in our Strategic Plan (2019). It is very rewarding to see the "fruits of our labor", as much effort has gone into this process.
- With the changes to the public health mandates, it was required that the Foundation Executive Committee update the Vaccination and Masking policies for both the office/Foundation as well as TeleMiracle. The policies have been updated to align with the current public health measures (including the upcoming change to masking requirements). Masks will not be required at TeleMiracle, but we still highly encourage wearing your mask as much as you are able. We are "serving the community's greatest need", and with TeleMiracle it is respectful to those we are serving if we do our best to preserve their health.
- Our most recent board meeting was on February 26. At this meeting the board reviewed 66 applications and granted \$229,816.98.
- Being on the Foundation Board is such an amazingly rewarding experience, and is the highlight of Kin careers for many. If this is





Saskatchewan Crime Stoppers

Saskatchewan Crime Stoppers is a nonprofit organization that combines the efforts of the public, media, and police to assist in solving crime in our communities. Founded in 1987, Saskatchewan Crime Stoppers receives anonymous tips of criminal activity in Saskatchewan's rural municipalities, cities, towns, villages, and First Nations communities and works with the RCMP to provide this information.

The program, along with four others in the province (Regina, Saskatoon, Moose Jaw, Prince Albert) receive tips through a call center and online reporting system to collect detailed information which is forwarded to the respective law enforcement agency to complete an investigation. Saskatchewan Crime Stoppers protects the safety of those reporting the tip information by ensuring all contact remains anonymous and anyone providing information that results in an arrest or charge may be eligible for cash rewards of up to \$2000.

Highlights

The face of program operations, RCMP Coordinator Sgt. Rob Cozine met with 9 detachments to review program activities and 8 rural, urban and/or First Nations representatives to promote our program and answers questions. SARM and SUMA Virtual Tradeshows were attended in 2021 and Sgt. Cozine held a webinar with stakeholders in May to present and field questions about the program. We hope to continue our public outreach in 2022 as restrictions continue to lift.

Other highlights include a digital billboard campaign in August that featured missing and wanted individuals along with a general awareness theme covering 18 communities with 375,000 plays and an estimated 6.5 million views. Our Facebook page continues to grow with now over 34,000 followers and an impressive 46% of all cases featured on the page being solved.




