

## KIN EDUCATION

Hello District 3,

I was looking through the Kin Education Manual from Kin Canada and thought I would share two very important pieces of information about Kin. The structure as well as how the Association is related to you.

I hope everyone is having a great Kin year and is excited as we enter Telemiracle season in District 3!!

#### STRUCTURE OF THE ASSOCIATION

Kin Canada is a service club that stretches from coast to coast in Canada. Being as large as it is, the Association is divided into four different levels for administrative purposes, those being National, District, Zone, and Club.

On a National level, we elect on a single ballot, only one National Vice President. The National Board of Directors consists of the National President, National Vice President, Past National President, and up to eight National Directors, and the addition of the Executive Director, who is a nonvoting staff member. National Directors are elected to represent the Association for a term of three years with even numbered Districts electing new Directors during even years and odd numbered Districts during odd year. This provides continuity on the National Board.

The Association is divided into eight Districts. At District Conventions, some Districts elect a Kinsmen and Kinette Governor, while others only elect a single Governor. The Governor(s), along with their Executives and councils oversee the clubs and programs in the District. Vice Governor(s) are also elected and become part of the District Executive the year before their Governor year. Districts may decide whether to elect the Governors jointly, have the Kinsmen elect the Kinsmen Governor and the Kinettes elect the Kinette Governor, or elect one leader to represent the District. The Districts are numbered in the order they were created.

Each District is comprised of Zones. Each Zone is comprised of several clubs, typically there are eight to ten clubs in each. Some zones have single leadership (the Deputy Governor could be a male or female) and some Zones a Kinsmen

### KIN EDUCATION

Deputy Governor represents the Kinsmen & Kin Clubs, and a Kinette Deputy Governor represents the Kinette Clubs. The Deputy Governors provide the Clubs and their Presidents with advice and act as liaison to District.

The entire structure of Kin Canada is based on the Clubs as the members of the Association. It is here that community service work is done and the membership is kept dedicated to fellowship and service. No Zone, District, or National program can work without the Club, its informed and active Executive, and its dedicated members.

#### THE ASSOCIATION & YOU

The Association members are it's clubs. However, people are members of those clubs. Often referred to as Kinsmen, Kinettes and Kin, we belong to a very special Association and should be very proud of our achievements. Our pride in the Canadian way of life and personal development increases with our Kin experiences. We welcome people of all creeds and colours from all parts of Canada. The high ideals of personal development, fellowship and a commitment to community service link us together.

The Kin experience is not all work and no play. We enjoy warm fellowship with our friends and participate in countless recreational and social activities. Being a family-based organization, there are opportunities for total involvement through Kin by members, our significant others, and our children.

An integral part of being a member of a club is attending our meetings. We use the Kin Rules of order to help us achieve consensus by following the will of the majority while respecting the rights o the minority. Members of the general public are welcome to attend our club meetings. We are not religious based, and do not exclude anyone of good moral standing. We do not have secret handshakes, although many clubs sing the Kin Song at the start of a meeting in an effort to generate enthusiasm and the feeling of teamwork.

Kin Canada is a means to public service and personal betterment. Our purpose is to do unselfish community service in an open atmosphere of friendship. The purpose of the Association is therefore practical and public, not mystical or secret.

Kin affords its members the opportunity for growth through public speaking, personal motivation, the use of parliamentary procedures, sound business practices and public relations. There is something for everyone. In accepting the goals of service and fellowship, we are expected to take part in the Association's programs and club projects. The motto of the Association is "SERVING THE COMMUNITY'S GREATEST NEED". By doing so, members experience the satisfaction that comes with personal involvement.

Kin Canada taps the energy and experience of men and women at least 19 years of age. Kinship is therefore a noble way of life teaching high ideals. By promoting our clubs, increasing membership and by being involved, knowledgeable, dedicated members, our community life will be enriched.



# SOCIAL KIN-SOCIAL MEDIA SECURITY

### **FACEBOOK PRIVACY SETTINGS**

PRO: Everyone is on Facebook! CON: Everyone is on Facebook...

Facebook is a great site for keeping up to date with your friends, posting things you like/hate, and more. Facebook is a tool to connect with others. But what if you don't want everyone to see your posts?...



If you see a little icon of two people beside your name, then only your friends can see your post. MOST people these days have it set this way. If you haven't changed your Facebook settings, it will show a little *globe* beside your name, which means it is Public and ANYONE can see your posts. If you are a "big deal" (musician, public figure, business) and are using a profile instead of a page, then leave it global. As for the rest of us, "Friends" is a great setting, so that random people on the internet won't come peeking through all your photos of your kids (or pets, parties, etc).

### **Privacy Checkup:**

It used to be a pain in the butt to change settings... Facebook has made it easier with this little Privacy Checkup tool. I recommend going through it and changing your settings to more secure settings.



#### **BUT WAIT, THERE'S MORE!**

Not everything is solved using the "Privacy Checkup" tool, just some things. Want to dive deeper? Follow along.

In the top right corner of your screen, click on the little upside down triangle. Then click on SETTINGS.



Go through ALL the sections, and lock down your Privacy settings, Timeline and Tagging Settings, Notifications, etc.

For example, I have my profile locked down so that new shares/tags will not automatically show up on my wall, I have to review and allow them first. This means the "silly" (and I'm being nice here) posts that some friends or family might want to post me in but I don't want on my page, won't appear, ever, if I choose to not allow them on.

Another thing that I have on my account, since I am responsible for a few high-profile accounts, is "Code Generator". This way whenever I sign in to my Facebook profile on a new device, I will have to go to the code generator on my phone first, get the code, put it in, then the app will allow me access. Why the hassle? Because if someone tries hacking your account from their device, they will not get on, thanks to the Code Generator. (This can be found under "Security" at the top left, just under "General".

Hopefully this article has helped at least one person in locking down their settings. You never know who is looking at your account...now you can be sure it is only friends looking at your posts & pictures! As always, if you need help, just ask!

# SOCIAL KIN-TWITTER TAGS

### TAG... I'M IT!

Twitter is a great tool to send out a quick message and hope that all your followers see it, and share it, or even come to your event. But not everyone will be watching their feed at all times, and that's where TAGGING comes into play.

- To Tag, write your info/text as normal, THEN
- ADD a hashtag if relevant (I like to add #yqr if it's in Regina, so that people searching the #yqr hashtag will see it... media outlets will usually monitor your city airport code! #sask is also a good one... #TM41)

#### • MENTION/TAG someone...

Example: Check out our #TM41 event we're hosting this weekend! @sask kin @SC Kinsmen @Telemiracle (This tweet talks about TM41 and will notify the Swift Current Kinsmen, Telemiracle and Sask Kin Twitter accounts of this tweet, making them see the tweet, and then like it, and retweet (share) it for their followers, thus hopefully getting you some more people out to your event, etc.)

• ADD a photo! Tweets will get noticed much better if something draws your eyes to it. Photos are great if you have one. ALSO if you add a photo, you can tag other twitter accounts in that photo without using characters in the body of your tweet! See the examples to the right for tagging a photo. This will let you add up to 10 twitter accounts to your tweet, effectively branching out and hopefully spreading your word further!

Put it this way... I'm not actually always checking this Twitter account. I monitor about 6 other accounts, so unless you tag me, I'm not going to see your stuff, unless I go randomly browsing... (ain't nobody got time fo' that!) So if you TAG my account, I'll see then, I'll share it. Deal? Awesome.



# THE BASICS OF PLANNED GIVING



What is Planned Giving?

A planned gift is a charitable gift that is integrated into your overall financial and estate plans. Generally, the most effective planned gifts tend to be gifts of appreciated property. This is because the greater the gift's appreciation, the greater the charitable deduction to the donor and the lower the "net" cost of gifting by the donor! A gift of appreciated property to charity directly may avoid capital gains tax and may qualify for an income tax charitable deduction.


Bequests represent probably the most popular form of planned gift, along with making charities beneficiaries of life insurance policies or gifting the policies themselves.

- 1. Wills and bequests—Bequests are a gift that is transferred after death by will or trust. A bequest may be in cash, marketable securities, tangible personal property or in a percentage of the residue of your estate. The estate is reduced by the full fair market value of a charitable gift, thereby potentially reducing the impact of the federal transfer tax on the donor's estate.
- **2. Life insurance and annuities**—Life insurance can make an excellent charitable gift. The substantial leverage involved in insurance affords you the capability of gifting a significant amount for a relatively small cost. You have several options in making a life insurance gift:
  - a) You can give a fully paid-up life insurance policy or a single premium policy to your organization.
  - b) You can give your organization a life insurance policy where premium payments are still being made. In order for the donor to qualify for a substantial deduction against adjusted gross income ("AGI"), you must continue to make contributions directly to your organization which, in turn, uses the contributions to pay premiums to the insurance company. Should you pay premiums directly to the insurance company on behalf of

the charity, you may qualify for a deduction for a significant percentage of the donor's AGI.

- c) You can give your organization a brand new policy with no premiums paid in. Although this gift will not qualify for an income tax charitable deduction, any future premiums paid may be deductible.
- **3. Large capital gifts**—You can make a contribution of large capital gifts of cash, stock and/or mutual funds in order to support your charitable. In addition to supporting your organization, you may be able to take a substantial income tax charitable deduction.
