We have had one surprise that has taken us over budget this year, and that is the accountant bill from last year. As Governor Rob and I talked about at FLC in Yorkton, this bill is from 2 years worth of accounting audits and that is why it is so much more substantial than other years. With that said however, accounting fees have increased in the past few years. We would ask that any district 3 members who have information on an accountant in Saskatchewan who would be willing and is qualified to establish a working relationship with our organization forward that information to us. If you already are an accountant who is qualified and willing to do audits on a non-profit organization's financial books please contact us as we would love to work with you! If you are someone or know someone please have them contact either myself, Shantal Reiter at seprentice@hotmail.com or Governor Rob Bateman at robbateman@sasktel.net.

I also want to remind ALL clubs to please PAY YOUR DUES! They are now quite overdue as the deadline was Nov.15, 2017. District 3 policy states that a club may not participate in TeleMiracle if you have not paid your district dues, so again, PAY YOUR DUES! I also would like to remind clubs that the district dues assessment is based on the SEPTEMBER 30th roster numbers that come directly from National Headquarters. It is each club's responsibility to update their roster with National Headquarters before the middle of September each year so that they are charged for the appropriate amount of club members. Thank you for your cooperation.

What's Up, Watrous?

On October 21st and December 2nd, we hosted our annual Craft and Trade Shows. We host each show, as well as a Soup & Sandwich lunch at each show, with the lunch proceeds from our Trade Show going to Telemiracle.

On October 31st, we once again held Trick or Eat in Watrous. Our club, as well as some Watrous Highschool Volunteers, canvassed the town of Watrous for Food Bank Donations. We have a lot of fun doing this event and would recommend it to other clubs! People are very receptive and generous to Food Bank Canvassing on October 31st, as they already have to answer the door all night anyway! :)

From January 8th to January 14th, we sold Insurance around Watrous for the Telemiracle Toilets. This insures residences from the dreaded Toilets for Telemiracle! On January 15th, the toilet placements commenced and we

will be running this fundraiser until February 2nd. Basically, if you get a toilet passed to your lawn and you are not insured, a donation to Telemiracle will get the toilet off your lawn, or you have to keep it for 24 hours! If you donate \$20 or more, you get to pick the next residence to send the toilet to. This is a lot of work for our club (we can get the call at any time) but also a lot of fun and the community has responded surprisingly well! Last year we ran the toilets for about 3 weeks and raised over \$5000 for Telemiracle. We are running the toilets for a few days less this year but have goals to increase our toilet moving efficiency and hopefully have some great success again! After selling insurance and our first day of dumping toilets, we had already raised over \$1,000 for Telemiracle!

On March 24th, 2018 we will be hosting "Mock Wedding 2.0 - Destination Wedding" which will be a caribbean/

destination wedding themed event with supper, entertainment and a cabaret to follow. In 2016, our event sold out in just a few days and so far it seems that the excitement for our Mock Wedding events is still alive and well so we are hoping to have another successful event again this year! Our last Mock Wedding went to Telemiracle 40 but the proceeds from this Mock Wedding will go to efforts in Watrous to build a new co-operative/ community daycare. We have a shortage of daycare providers in Watrous so we feel this truly is the community's greatest need at this time!

We have our usual events coming up this year yet too (Lodge Bingos, Meals on Wheels, Arts Council Set Ups, etc.) but the events above are the bigger events we have planned so far for this Kin year.
