First of all I want to thank all of you for all the hard work put into service and fundraising projects! I want to take this opportunity to provide you with a few updates and reminders.

**National Day of KINdness** – Thank you to all the clubs that registered and participated. We had 23 clubs register for National Day of KINdness. We may have had more clubs participate, but they were not registered with Kin Canada, so they would not be included in the numbers

**Canadian Blood Services** – Half of all Canadians will either need blood or know someone who will need blood at some point in their lives. Yet only four percent of Canadians donate.

# SERVICE DIRECTOR

As partners for life with Canadian Blood Services we hope to change that. Last year we donated 1010 units of blood, exceeding our goal of 615 units by 64%! Kin Canada has pledged 725 blood donations from our members, family and friends in 2018 with District 3 pledging 65 units of blood. As of March 31, 2018, we have had 13 donations. ## **HOW YOU CAN HELP:**

1. Register to be an organ donor
  - Every province has a different process, but all are quick and easy to do. Go to <http://organtissuedonation.ca/en> to find out how to register where you live.
2. Talk to your family about your decision
  - Even if you have documented your wishes by registering through a provincial registry it is vital that your family knows about your decision. In most provinces, hospital staff will still talk with the next-of-kin of potential donors about what their loved one requested. Donor families say they are comforted by the feeling that their loved one's death was not in vain.
3. Spread the word
  - Only about 20% of Canadians have registered their decision to be an organ and tissue donor, even though public opinion polls show that about 90% of Canadians support the idea. Many are unaware of how to register or are misinformed on eligibility or the process to register.

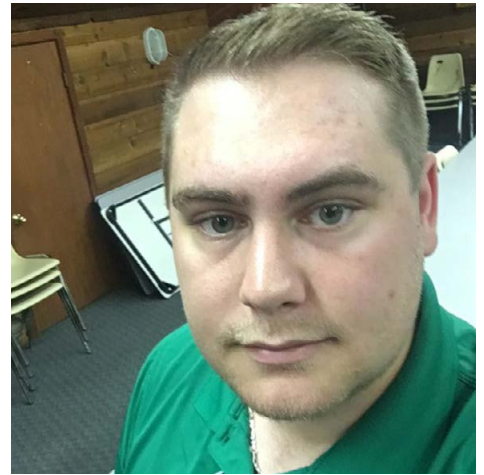

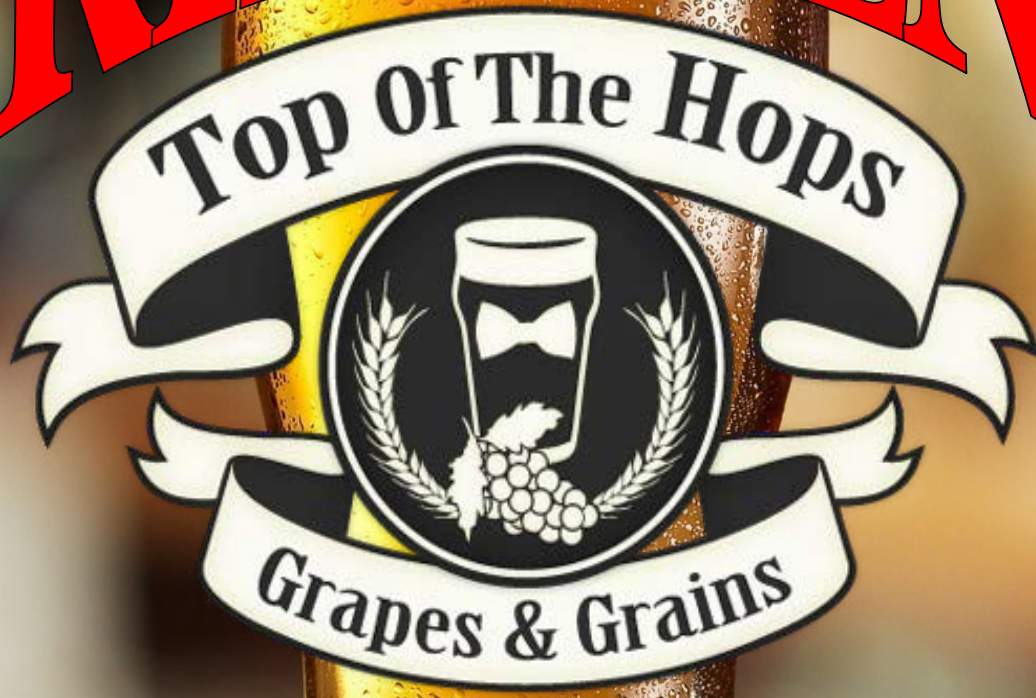

# Kin Quill Award Submission

In June 2013 I lost my dad to lung cancer and it took until January 2016 to clear the fog of missing him so much. Tears and family time had me feeling well enough to take on the year.

I remember vividly finishing folding socks as I waited for my cousin Chanda to text back so I could spend time with her and her family.

One phone call changed my life forever. January 3, 2016 at 10:03am my phone rang. It was my cousin Chad (Chanda's older brother). He never called. "Hi cousin, what's up?"

"Chanda and Jordan were in a car accident and they are dead."

"DEAD! How! When! Oh my god, where are the kids?"

We later learned they were killed by a drunk driver. McGuire (age 2) passed away at 6am in Chad's arms. Kamryn (age 5) was alive but doctors had one more test to determine if she was brain dead.

I was in shock. I went into crisis mode. "What can I do?"

Chad asked me to call family and explain what happened; no small feat as we are a family of 90+. I began explaining the accident to everyone over and over. The noise from my one aunt's reaction will haunt me forever.

Friends came and went. I finally took a moment to have a shower. That's the moment I felt my heart break. I have never heard such noises come out of me before. The pain came through as a wail. I sobbed in the shower unable to breathe. How could this be my life? I avoid showering and bath instead. When I do shower, I have flash backs to that afternoon, so I avoid it as much as I can.

That Sunday evening I went to the hospital. I didn't know what else to do. I went up to the PICU and found my family. By this time the doctors had confirmed our little blonde haired, blue-eyed, spitfire of a girl was indeed brain dead. Kamryn was kept alive so her organs could be donated.

I was very lucky to sit with Kamryn and hold

her warm hand. Even with her black eye & gash on her face, she still looked beautiful.

Her teddy bear was beside her under a heated blanket. Her cuts had to be wiped and fluid ran from her nose. I sat and told her everything I wanted her mom to know; that Chanda was my best friend, and I didn't know how I would get through this without her, but I would try to be strong for her and the family. I told Kamryn to make sure that McGuire's big blue eyes never quit smiling. Kamryn my girl, how I will miss our adventures, I will think of you always.

The organ recovery team flew in that Monday. Kamryn went into surgery. Our little hero's organs saved six lives. We watched her go into the operation alone.

The week continued on with family visits. I was asked to do Chanda's celebration of life. How could I say no? The following Saturday I stood up in front of a thousand people and said goodbye to my cousin; but she was much more than that. She was my best friend, and she had always been there for me, no matter what.

After the funeral, everyone returned home and back to their lives. I was left in Saskatoon alone. Everywhere I went were memories with Chanda and the kids. I went through my days like a zombie. I now had anxiety and started getting panic attacks. Not being in control of my feelings was so frustrating. Never knowing when the next attack would happen made me feel helpless.

Panic attacks and anxiety made the simplest of things impossible. I missed birthday parties and other fun events. Spending time with children was heart breaking.

Life moved on so fast for everyone else. But, I was just so sad. Some of my friends pulled away, claiming I was too hard to be around. It made them too sad. When I needed people the most, some so-called "friends" were

nowhere to be found.

I was very lucky to have a small core group of friends there for me. They picked me up when I was at my lowest, multiple times. They didn't care whether I was fun or not. They were just there. Our family became even closer, and we held each other up.

In early 2017 I was searching for something more in my life. Something with purpose. I needed to feel useful again. A friend of mine had suggested joining the Kinettes. She knew I used to love helping others and fundraising for good causes. I had fell into depression, spent a lot of time alone, and my mind would go to bad places; wondering if it mattered if I was on earth anymore? Maybe the pain would finally end? I knew I needed to do something.

I took the plunge and emailed the club. February 2017 was my first meeting. I was very leery and very afraid. The thought of all those new people gave me such anxiety, but I took a deep breath and walked in, and I haven't looked back since.

The ladies were so friendly and accepting. I was so excited after my first meeting. I couldn't wait to get involved with all the great events.

I was installed in October 2017. I love the support and positivity from the club. Planning and fundraising have always been passions of mine, and I feel like I've finally found my place. I feel like I have a purpose again. The amazing opportunities that have come along are already amazing. Best of all I have met so many great new people, who empower other women.

I have slowly found my new normal, and the Kinettes are a huge part of my new life. Thank you Saskatoon and District Kinettes for helping to save my life.
