Club donations help Cystic Fibrosis Canada to continue to work on a future where a diagnosis of Cystic Fibrosis does not have to mean losing a loved one.

Canadian Blood Services (CBS) & Kin Canada's partnership focuses on encouraging members to give blood and recruit other blood donors. Our current goal for District 3 is 50 donations, we are at 43 right now. We have until December 31/17 to make that happen. I also want to remind clubs about National Day of KINdness, which is on February 24, 2018. I encourage you to make this a line item on your budget or spend some time thinking of some possible creative ways to get involved in your community! I'd love to see more clubs involved!

Service reporting by Clubs is no longer required after each event. There will be a form sent to clubs by email in June 2018 to complete. Tools are available in the member centre so that you can track your hours and dollars.

Are you are looking for project ideas to kickoff your year, to help bring the club together, recruit new members, have fun and help your community? National has released the Projects database. It already has many awesome projects to review, and will continue to grow. http://www.kincanada.ca/projects

Some very impressive numbers were revealed at National Convention this year. Highlights include raising \$1,186,583 for Cystic Fibrosis, bringing our total to over \$45 million throughout our 53 year partnership, and another \$47,000 for the students of Canada through the Hal Rogers Endowment Fund. And, of course, all Kin must be recognized for raising a truly astounding \$18,679,622 for the people of Canada.



RISK MANAGEMENT

Happy fall to District 3 Kin!

Welcome back to all returning members and welcome to all new members in our District. As we start a new year, I look back to when I joined Kin in 2003. It seems like yesterday, but it has been an amazing experience. I have met so many fantastic people along the journey, all while serving the community and having lots of fun. District 3 has a great team in place and I am proud to be part of it as the D3 Risk Manager.

As Risk Manager, it is important to ensure all clubs send in their incorporation papers to ISC (Information Services). Secondly, you need to fill out insurance forms. The deadline is November 15. It is important to be in good standing as your club will be running events within the community.

A few other things for clubs are to use the Kin Canada website for resources. There is a Risk management Guide with forms related to mitigating risk. Secondly, I recommend that if your club holds activities where you serve alcohol to take the Serve It Right Course. For a small cost, it can be invaluable. Also, be extremely diligent when dealing with money and financial matters. It is important to have systems for proper management of funds within your club, and for money when raising funds.

It is best to be proactive than reactive.



Books for Bikes

For three years the Kinette Club of Assiniboia has sponsored a Books for Bikes program. In a nutshell, the program promotes literacy by supporting the literacy initiatives put forth by the schools in Assiniboia. At the Pre-K to Grade 4 school, the students must receive a blackout on a monthly bingo card full of reading activities to receive an entry, while at the Grade 5 to Grade 8 school, students must complete a little write-up about a book they've read which is then posted in the school's library for an entry. At the end of the school year, one lucky student from each school is chosen as the winner and can select any bike from Harvey's Home Hardware in Assiniboia, who sells the bikes to the Assiniboia Kinettes at cost. The winner also receives a bike helmet from Safe Communities Assiniboia. The Saskatoon Kinettes run a similar program, which served as the basis for the Assiniboia project. Working directly with the schools, the club's primary focus is to get kids to read and to provide a reward for positive actions. The program has been well received by the schools and last year there were over 300 entries in the Pre-K to Grade 4 school.

On September 27, Assiniboia 7th Avenue School, which has students from pre-kindergarten through Grade 4, welcomed Lisa Martin, the project chair, into the gym for the 2017-2018 Books for Bikes Kick-off. In front of almost 250 students and faculty, Lisa talked about the club, the program, the requirements and when the draw will be held. The presentation ended with the reading of a fun children's book titled Skippy Jon

Jones and the Great Bean Caper, with help from the kids through the use of a giant flash card! (When the flash card was held up the students had to yell "Skippy Jon Jones!" and they did a great job!)

The program will be launched at Assiniboia Elementary School, Grades 5 to 8, after Christmas.




