My name is Lori and I'm a Life member from the Kinette Club of Macklin.

I am your Risk Manager this year & will be your go-to for any

questions or help you need filling out your Insurance papers and Incorporation documents. The deadline for these important forms is Nov 15th.

Also this year our National Insurance company needs Vulnerable sector checks done on any new members, the President and Treasurer of the club. Eventually it will be every member, and some clubs are actually going ahead and doing every member.

You need a consent form to take with you to your local police station, here are the steps to get that:

- go to the IKIN website (www.ikin.ca)
- Click on the Risk Manager icon

- Go to the "Police Check Letter" and print off the form - this is what you take to the police station. This page on IKIN also contains the consent form that needs to be filled out and then you upload on SYNC (instructions also found on this page) Any issues contact myself or Melanie Nieson (her info is at the bottom of that Risk Manager page on the IKIN website)

The Vulnerable Sector Check is good for 3yrs and it must be submitted within 90 days after it was issued.

I will be keeping close tabs on all the clubs in the District and will be reaching out if I hear from National or District that you're having trouble with paperwork.

Service reporting by Clubs is no longer required after each event. Clubs will be asked to submit their total service dollars and hours in June, more information to follow. Tools will be available on iKin so that you can keep track.

It's my pleasure to provide my first report to you as the Kinsmen Foundation Executive Director. It was an honour to be chosen to take on this role as of June 15, 2018. My thanks to the Foundation Management Committee for placing their trust in me.

Like so many Saskatchewanians, I grew up a Telemiracle fan and supporter. It's humbling and inspiring to now be part of the committed team of staff and countless volunteers who not only make the telethon happen each year, but give their time and talent on the Foundation side to help people every day with specialized mobility equipment and assistance for medical travel.

Though the Foundation Board of Directors does not meet formally during July and August, the work of Saskatchewan's charity doesn't stop. We had an incredibly busy summer in the office dealing with emergency applications; between the June and September board meetings, more than \$260,000 in assistance was provided to applicants. 
