This year is a special one—District 3 is celebrating 100 years of Kin, and TeleMiracle is marking its 50th anniversary. While dedicated committees are leading the way in organizing events and fundraisers for these milestones, I want to ensure that we take time to honor our past while building our future. To help celebrate, I will be launching a 100-year social media campaign to highlight the history, impact, and incredible work of our clubs and members over the years. Through club spotlights, interviews, and historical features, we will showcase what Kin has meant to District 3 and inspire the next generation to continue our legacy.

Looking ahead, I want clubs to take a moment to reflect on their own future. In-person support will always be an option for clubs that need guidance, and we will work together to ensure everyone feels confident and equipped for success.

Spring Zone Conferences are a great opportunity to connect with fellow Kin, learn more about what's happening in the district, participate in the speak-off competition, and take on leadership roles. If you've ever thought about getting more involved, I encourage you to consider becoming a Zone Deputy Governor. It's a rewarding role that allows you to work closely with clubs, help with their projects, and serve as a key connection between clubs and the district team. In addition to leadership development, I am also working on new non-dues revenue initiatives, including grants and sponsorships, to support the financial future of the district. 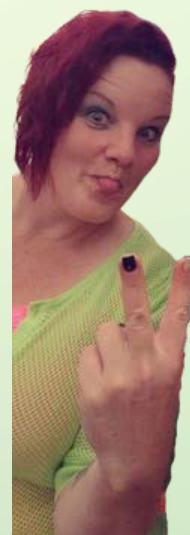

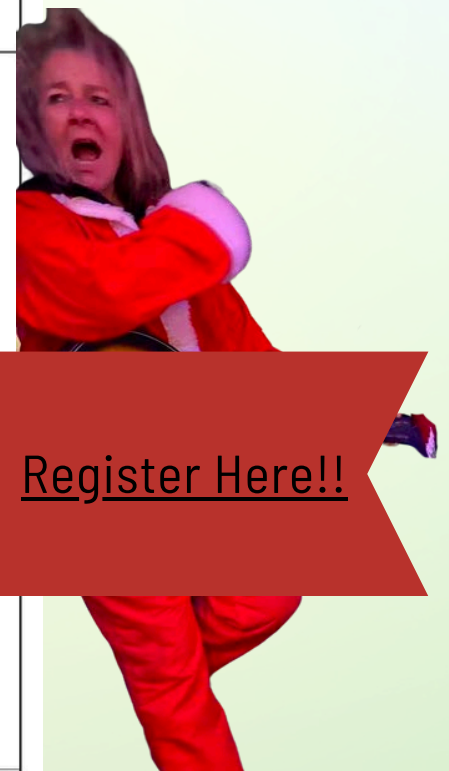

The generosity of the people of Saskatchewan continues to amaze me, as does their unwavering support for the Kinsmen Foundation.

As we enter the final three months of this KIN year, I want to extend my deepest appreciation to the dedicated members of the Kinsmen Foundation. Your hard work and commitment have made a significant impact on those in need. So far this year, the Foundation has received 629 applications and has gifted an incredible \$2,294,817 in support.

I also want to extend an invitation to any KIN members who may be interested in attending a Foundation meeting. If you'd like to participate, please reach out to me or Geneen at the Foundation Office. My time with the Kinsmen Foundation has been the highlight of my KIN career—seeing firsthand how Kinsmen, Kinettes, and KIN members make a difference in people's lives every day is truly inspiring.
